The farmer said, "I could take him far out into the woods. I could leave him there. He would not be able to find his way back. I might do that. I will think about it."


The dog heard them talking. He knew what they were saying. They did not want him any more. That made Rex sad.

"Ah, well," said the wolf. "That is the way people are."


"There is nothing I can do," said Rex.
