

Looking for love

- 1. Finding a romantic partner can sometimes feel like a full-time job. When your friends are all in **steady** relationships, you may feel even more alone. Many singles turn to online dating. Dating sites and apps allow you to preview the **profiles** of other singles in your area.
- 2. People try online dating for different reasons. Some men and women are tired of being set up by **mutual friends**. Others are too shy to approach people of the same or opposite sex. Divorced singles may find it the most comfortable way to get back into **the dating scene**.
- 3. There are many different dating sites and apps to choose from. Some couples **swear by** a specific one. After finding each other's profiles in a large **database**, they describe their relationship as a **match made in heaven**. In truth, their match was made with Internet **filters**.
