Greetings! A couple of weeks ago, I witnessed something that was both remarkable and emotional. No, I'm not talking about the plot-twisting ending of the latest Marvel Avengers film (however, I don't read the comics and didn't see it coming). I am talking about a naturalization ceremony.

To provide some context, the man I watched proudly take his oath, pledging allegiance to the United States of America alongside others from all parts of the Earth, wanted nothing more than to be welcomed and accepted. This man has waited a long time for this very day. He came to the United States in search of work and a better living to support his parents who were rural farmers in Mexico. The cost and standard of living is so drastically different from the U.S. that a little under \$300 a month helped to support food,

Becoming Your Own Hero

In the summer of 2017, ABE student Jasper was working hard and making excellent progress towards his goals. He had just been recognized as LSW's 2017 ABE Student of Inspiration for his tenacity and perseverance in basic-level studies, and he had transitioned to preparing for secondary instruction.

Around that time, however, Jasper lost his job of ten years. He had endured poor treatment and conditions, with grace and fortitude, for many of those years. Nonetheless, his employer terminated him and several of his colleagues that summer.

But achievement inspires confidence. When challenges arise, confidence can make a world of difference in navigating through the unknown, and Jasper was undeterred.

He focused on building his skills and made quick progress through our pre-secondary curriculum. Jasper reliably attended drop-in math tutoring every Friday morning. He read books, wrote papers, and engaged in critical thinking discussions with his tutors and peers. All the while, he quietly researched Wisconsin labor standards and practices...

Jasper reached out to his former colleagues and explained to them what he had learned about employee rights. He persuaded them to join him in filing a formal complaint against their former employer for the years of unfair treatment and the subsequent wrongful terminations.

When the complaint was referred for binding arbitration, Jasper represented himself and his colleagues. He was successful in convincing the arbiter of the misdoings of the employer, and Jasper and his colleagues were awarded a favorable decision.

Jasper used that victory to further motivate him in pursuit of his goals. He gained entry into LSW's High School Equivalency Diploma see Jasper continued on page 3

shelter, and his parents' medical care. This man is my step-dad, Moi. While I am sure I will have the opportunity to share more of my life story at some other point, this is really about how the two of ours intersected.

Moi has been in my life since I was sixteen and has never been anything but kind, compassionate, and gracious. Moi raised my brother and me as his own. He came into our lives and made us a family in a way that I wasn't sure was possible at one time. He married my mother 13 years ago. That is how long this process has taken: 13 years! The judge presiding over the ceremony commented that our country isn't perfect and that we have more work to do. Welcoming people from other nations into our country always makes us better. We

must continue to strive for better together. Our pledge of allegiance states "with liberty and justice for all." Equality is basic. Equity is a step towards justice. As an official U.S. citizen, the first thing on Moi's "to do" list is to register to vote. He takes his civic duty seriously.

This made me reflect on the English language learners that come to LSW every day. They represent 56 countries throughout the world. Last year, ten LSW English language students received their citizenship. I have been so close to the naturalization process for so long and yet I had never attended the ceremony. It was impressive to see first-hand the pride and patriotism that beamed from the courtroom and our new friends and neighbors.





Two Women - One Mission

Non-profit organizations are indeed fortunate when they are blessed by unsung heroes who unstintingly dedicate unique skills and endless hours to missions they cherish. Holly Ann Pape and Sr. Vonnie DeCleene were two of those heroes to Literacy Services of Wisconsin and Milwaukee Achiever Literacy Services. Holly died this past July, leaving a legacy of quiet and devoted service to our community. Sr. Vonnie passed away a month later in August, leaving many to honor her lifelong commitment to adult literacy.

Holly joined the LSW board in the early 1980s and was soon named Treasurer. With a limited staff at the time, almost every aspect of financial management was handled by the person in that volunteer position! This included tracking income, paying bills, processing payroll, preparing financial statements, and handling all reports required by state and federal governments. Virtually everything was done manually back then, so these tasks consumed significant amounts of Holly's time while she also held positions of responsibility at Associated Bank and Park Bank.

Later adding the role of Vice President-Finance to her LSW work, Holly was committed to careful monitoring, accurate work, and timely reporting. She was diligent about calling to the board's attention any financial



concerns she perceived emerging in the future. Even after Holly's board service ended in FY1993-94, she enthusiastically supported LSW's mission. Literacy, she believed, was vital for all.

Sr. Vonnie was a staff member at Milwaukee Achiever from 1992 to 2007. Even after retiring, she continued volunteer tutoring. She was a force. Her commitment to her students was always the focus of everything she did. At her funeral, many of her former students and colleagues shared the ways in which she had changed lives. She was supportive of the merger between Milwaukee

Achiever and Literacy Services because she knew our important work and mission would be even better with the two organizations together. She attended the Inspiration Awards that were held this past May, just months before passing. She often called her sister, who also volunteers with LSW, to ensure she had a ride and could be present.

These are just two stories of women who have helped to shape the Literacy Services of today. Their memories will never be forgotten, and their commitment to literacy will live on as we continue to serve our mission.

Given the tenacity that he has shown throughout his time at LSW, I have no doubt that he will be incredibly successful in all his future pursuits.

Satoko honored her tutor with a traditional Japanese tea service.




