Staying True

We have had an incredible start to 2025. Not only have we celebrated 60 years of adult literacy service to the community, we also opened the first-ever adult education hub that provides comprehensive adult education programming.

When we support adults, we uplift families. We change generations. In 1965, LSW was founded. Over the past six decades, we've learned a lot – not just about literacy, but about humanity, resilience, and the power of opportunity. I want to share six truths – that shape everything we do:

Truth One:

Growth thrives on encouragement.

Our students come to LSW motivated — motivated by opportunity, by the pursuit of something for themselves and their families, and by the desire to build a better future. They arrive with clear goals: earning a GED or HSED, improving English proficiency, developing digital skills, advancing in their careers, or supporting their children's education. Whatever drives our students, achieving those goals is made easier when we provide encouragement and a clear path forward.





At LSW, growth comes through dedicated tutors, personalized instruction, and a welcoming community of learning. Last year alone, our 270 volunteers contributed nearly 8,000 hours of one-on-one tutoring. In addition, our partners at MATC and WCTC supported us with instructors who create a connection between LSW and the technical colleges. They are the steady presence, the voice that says, "I support you and you got this."

Truth Two:

Systemic barriers keep too many adults from opportunity.

We live in a world where barriers continue to prevent many adults from accessing educational opportunities. Over 100,000 Milwaukee adults lack a high school diploma. Over 200,000 adults in Milwaukee and Waukesha struggle with low literacy. Literacy and graduation rates are NOT tied to intelligence. That's not because they're unmotivated or not "smart enough." Many of our adult students navigate so much when they decide to add our educational programming to their lives – food and housing insecurity, lack of access to technology, unreliable

transportation – yet they remain full of potential.

We meet our students where they are at BOTH academically and geographically. This is why we have 8 locations across Milwaukee, Waukesha, and Racine. Access to opportunity is our top priority.



Truth Three:

Determination fuels transformation.

Our students embody determination. LSW students show up consistently. They stay up late studying. They ask questions. They take every opportunity to learn, knowing that their



Literacy Rocks the Eagles Ballroom!





Keynote Speaker

Benglo Kabengele

is a devoted husband, father, and lifelong learner from the Democratic Republic of the Congo. He arrived in the U.S. in 2017 with a bachelor's degree in computer science but soon realized that language barriers and credential challenges made it difficult to pursue his career. Determined to succeed, he earned his **HSED** at Literacy Services of Wisconsin in 2021, went on to complete an IT associate's degree at MATC, and is now working toward a bachelor's degree at UW-Milwaukee.

At LSW's 60th Anniversary celebration, Benglo shared his inspiring journey as a Student Speaker and was honored with a scholarship to continue his education. The following excerpt from his speech reflects both his perseverance and the vital role LSW has played in helping him reach his goals.

In 2018, as I struggled to figure out how to move forward on this new journey, a friend introduced me to Literacy Services of Wisconsin. He told me that LSW offered one-on-one tutoring and could help me get back on track toward my career goals. That moment changed everything. I walked into LSW, unsure but hopeful.

LSW didn't just teach me English-they focused on me as a person, on my dreams, and on my future. I was assigned a tutor who helped me with language, but more importantly, we talked about my goals. Through LSW, I learned about the HSED program. At first, I didn't expect to go back for something I had already achieved, but LSW showed me that education is about opportunity, not just certificates.

LSW assigned me an academic advisor who helped me navigate the U.S. education system, ensuring I was on the right path. I also learned about certifications and received personalized career advice to align my education with my long-term goals.

I completed my HSED, which laid the founda-

and enrolled in the Information Science and Technology program.

I'm now officially one year away from completing my second bachelor's degree-THE FIRST IN AMERICA-and a Bachelor of Science in Information Science and Technology from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. This is a massive milestone for me. A few years ago, I could NOT fully see the path—only my dreams. The journey has NOT been easy and continues to be HARD WORK-balancing full-time work, studies, family, and community commitments—but it's been worth the challenge.

Graduation won't be the end of my journey. I have no plans to stop. I'm committed to continuing my education, whether earning new certifications, pursuing a master's degree, or exploring new opportunities in IT and leadership.

In addition to LSW's support, I'm grateful for the support of my family. One of the most important things I've learned is that education isn't just about personal achievement. It's about lifting up those around you. Thanks to LSW, my wife has also been able to enroll in programs that will help her achieve her own educational and career goals. As we build our new American dream together, it's officially become an LSW family affair.

LSW is a lifeline for adults who didn't have the chance to complete their education or who face barriers to success. Many of us come to this country with dreams, skills, and experience, but we're often overwhelmed by the idea of starting from scratch.

By offering educational support, career advice, and personal mentorship, LSW makes literacy and education accessible and meaningful for everyone.

determination will shape their future and the future of their families.

In the past year, 50% of our students have been parents, balancing their learning with bedtime routines, school drop-offs, and scraped knees. This proves that the desire to improve their own lives often goes hand-in-hand with a fierce commitment to improving the lives of their children. We provide the tools – GED and HSED, workforce readiness, English language instruction, and digital literacy. But our students do the work.

The result isn't just personal success. It's powerful. It's children watching their parents light up in a new way. It's confidence passed down from one generation to the next. Determination doesn't just move one person forward. It moves entire families. Entire communities. Entire generations.

Truth Four:

ALL progress toward goals creates momentum for the future.

A job application submitted. A GED earned. A driving exam passed. A Zoom meeting successfully joined. An interview crushed. All of this progress adds up to something much greater – a future full of possibilities. At LSW, we're committed to helping students take meaningful steps towards their goals.

Last year, 87% of our adult students showed measurable skill gains in reading and numeracy scores, and 230 learners earned their high school equivalency. To put that into perspective, that is compared to an average annual total of 16 graduates at other community-based organizations.

When students complete their education, they don't just gain skills – they gain the tools they need to achieve their dreams. These

aren't just statistics; these are families, these are futures.

Truth Five:

We provide the infrastructure; you bring the vision.

At LSW, we create programmatic pathways, offering programs for every academic level and partnerships to holistically support our student experience. But it's our students who bring their vision to life. I often share when giving a tour to new LSW friends that because we work for adult students, we don't tell them what they SHOULD do: INSTEAD, we listen and provide programming that supports them with what they need to move closer to that goal – their goal.

We opened the doors to our biggest vision yet: a new home in Milwaukee's Brewer's Hill neighborhood on July 16. This has been nearly two years in the making. This is going to be a game-changer for adult education in Milwaukee.

Multimedia classrooms. An onsite GED testing center. Private enrollment spaces. A volunteer and student lounge. Thoughtfully designed to remove barriers and make every adult student feel seen, welcomed, and supported. This building is the standard for what adult education can and should be. Our students deserve this, and the organization should be proud of this moment in our 60-year history. This new space means we can serve hundreds more adult students each year. But even in this new space, it's the students who fill it with purpose.

Truth Six:

We prepare you to keep moving forward.

For 60 years, LSW's goal has been to equip every enrolled adult with the tools, the knowl-

edge, and the confidence to walk forward on their own.

Because literacy is not just the ability to read.

Literacy is understanding a prescription. Writing a message to a teacher. Reading a lease. Sending a message to a landlord. Understanding a bank statement. Distinguishing misinformation on social media.

Literacy is about navigating the world with clarity, confidence, and dignity. It's about discovering new sides of yourself that were always there and that allow you to move forward.

And that kind of confidence and mindset doesn't happen overnight. It happens when someone is in your corner. When someone believes you can do it. We believe every student that walks through our door deserves the opportunity to learn. That's what LSW is. A place that says, "You've got this."
